SUMMARY:

Submitted are final plans and specifications for the Lexington Pocket Park II improvements, located at 5707 Lexington Ave., Los Angeles, 90038. The project is a Prop 12 and CDBG Funded Project. Plans for this project were prepared by the Department of Public Works, Bureau of Engineering, Architectural Division. Their estimate for the construction cost of this project is \$242,400.00. The plans provide for improvements of this site to develop a pocket park. The following is a general list of the improvements to be made at this site:

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- 1. Security Lighting
- 2. ADA-Accessible Play Equipment for older children on Resilient Surface
- 3. Asphalt Paths through park
- 4. Automated Irrigation System
- 5. Drinking Fountain
- 6. New Concrete Block Walls, Fencing, and Gates
- 7. Picnic Tables, and Game Tables
- 8. New Landscaping
- 9. New Combination Volleyball/Basketball Court

In compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), staff has determined that the proposed park development will not have a significant impact on the environment. This project has been determined to be Categorically Exempt per City CEQA guidelines Article VII, Section 1(c) (new construction of small structures), and 1(p) (transfer of ownership in land in order to create parks). A Notice of Exemption was filed with the Los Angeles City Clerk's office on November 29, 2001, and posted by the County Clerk's office on November 29, 2001.

The bid package has been approved by the City Attorney's Office.

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT:

There is no immediate fiscal impact to the department; however, future operations and maintenance costs will be assessed upon completion of the project.
