- 2. Award the contract to Morillo for a total contract amount of \$5,196,000 all according to the plans and specifications;
- 3. Authorize the Department's Chief Accounting Employee to encumber \$5,196,000 from the following funds and account numbers under the awarding authority of this Board Report;

SUMMARY:

On March 20, 2013, the Board approved final plans and call for bids for the Hollywood Recreation Center - Pool and Pool Building (PRJ1402B) (W.O. #E170344F) project, located at 1122 North Cole Avenue, Los Angeles, California 90038 (Board Report No. 13-069). Plans for this project were prepared by design consultant, Frank R. Webb Architects, under the direction of the Department of Public Works, Bureau of Engineering (BOE), Recreational and Cultural Facilities Program. The proposed scope of work involves the construction of a new approximately 9,600 square-foot pool with integrated splash area, pool deck, Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) access ramp and railing, waterslide, diving stand, and covered spectator areas. The scope of work also includes construction of a new pool building with shower facilities, life guard training, pool equipment room, storm water tank, irrigation and landscape and perimeter fence with gate. The pool component of the project is being funded with Quimby funds and the pool building component is being funded with Proposition K specified funds. The Proposition K ballot measure allocated a total of \$3,000,000 to construct a modern gymnasium and modern pool building. A total of \$1,500,000 out of the \$3,000,000 in Proposition K funds is being allocated to the pool building component of this project. The remaining \$1,500,000 is being reserved to be allocated to a future phase for construction of a modern gymnasium.

On April 23, 2013, nine (9) bids were received for this project. The lowest responsive and responsible bidder is Morillo Construction, with a base bid amount of \$5,196,000 which is \$1,104,000 below the City Engineer's cost estimate of \$6,300,000. The bid amounts received are as follows:

The bid specifications stated that the low bidder would be determined to be the responsible and responsive bidder submitting the lowest base bid. Morillo Construction submitted the lowest base bid, as shown above. It is recommended that the project be awarded to Morillo Construction, for a total construction contract of \$5,196,000.

The project is subject to the City's new Business Inclusion Program (BIP), in compliance with the Mayor's Directive No. 14, which replaces the former Minority Business Enterprise, Women Business Enterprise, and Other Business Enterprise (MBE/WBE/OBE) Good Faith Effort Subcontractor Outreach Program. Morillo Construction has successfully posted all the required BIP outreach documentation on the Los Angeles Business Virtual Assistance Network (LABAVN) that demonstrated satisfactory effort in its outreach to Minority Business Enterprise (MBE), Women Business Enterprise (WBE), Small Business Enterprise (SBE), Emerging Business Enterprise (EBE), Disabled Veteran Business Enterprise (DVBE), and Other Business Enterprise (OBE) for sub-bid or subcontracting businesses. Staff has evaluated the outreach documentation submitted by Morillo Construction, and determined that they have passed all six (6) indicators as required for the effort to obtain sub-bid/subcontracting participation by MBE, WBE, SBE, EBE, DVBE and OBE businesses, and is in compliance with the BIP outreach requirements. The outreach documentation package is on file in the Board Office, and a synopsis of the said package is attached to this Report.

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Staff reviewed the responsiveness and work performance of Morillo Construction on past Department projects and found them to be satisfactory. The Department of Public Works, Office of Contract Compliance (OCC) indicated that there have been no labor compliance violations and that all other legal requirements have been complied with by the bidder.

The City Attorney and staff have reviewed the bid submitted by Morillo Construction and found it to be in order. Staff recommends that the Board find Morillo Construction to be the lowest responsive and responsible bidder.

In accordance with the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), a Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) was prepared based on an Initial Study, which determined that all potentially significant environmental effects would be mitigated to a level less than significant. On December 8, 2010, the Board (Board Report No. 10-331) adopted the MND and associated Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Plan (MMRP), and a Notice of Determination was filed with the Los Angeles County Clerk on December 14, 2010. There have been no substantial changes in the project scope or the environmental setting, and the adopted MND is still valid. Therefore, no additional CEQA compliance is required.

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT:

There is no immediate fiscal impact to the Department's General Fund. The assessment of future operations and maintenance costs have yet to be determined and will be addressed in future budget requests.
